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I. THE COLLEGE PROFILE

Hindu College is recognized as one of the premier academic institutions in the country. It stands tall in public esteem and also in the memories of its alumni, many of whom are now prominent figures in government, business and industry, the media and education. Notwithstanding its name, students from all religions have grown up here and excelled in the chosen areas of their interests, be it academics, sports, or extra-curricular activities.

Hindu College was founded more than a century ago in 1899, by Late Shri Krishan Dassji Gurwale. In the backdrop of the nationalist struggle against British rule, some prominent citizens including Shri Gurwaleji of Delhi, decided to start a college that would, while being non-elitist and non-sectarian, provide nationalist education to the youth. Originally, the College was housed in a humble building in Kinari Bazar, Chandni Chowk, and it was affiliated to Punjab University as there was no Delhi University at that time. As the college grew, it faced a major crisis in 1902 due to inadequate infrastructure. But fortunately, at this point, Rai Bahadur Sultan Singh generously donated a part of his historic property, (which originally belonged to Col. Skinner) at Kashmere Gate, to the College, thereby enabling it to function there till 1953, following which, it moved to its present location in Delhi University.

Hindu College was a centre for intellectual and political debate during India's freedom struggle, especially during the Quit India Movement. This is the only College in Delhi to have a Students' Parliament since 1935, which in fact, provided a platform to many national leaders including Mahatma Gandhi, Pt. Moti Lal Nehru, Pt. Jawahar Lal Nehru, Sarojini Naidu, Annie Besant, Mohammad Ali Jinnah, and Subhash Chandra Bose for motivating the youth. Responding whole-heartedly to Gandhiji's Quit India call in 1942, the college played a leading role in India's freedom struggle as some teachers and students of the College even went to prison.

The College has seen remarkable growth over the years. And, today it is not only one of the most distinguished graduate and postgraduate co-educational institutions in the country, but is also, by many accounts, the college of first choice in Delhi. It boasts of an accomplished faculty of about one hundred and twenty members, and more than two thousand students. The College is also proud of its efficient and very supportive non-academic staff. It offers a number of courses in the Science, Humanities and the Social Science Streams. The College also has a rich collection of books and journals in its library, well-equipped laboratories, the NSS and NCC Rooms, etc. There is also a Students' Centre that offers the facilities of a seminar room, bank, computer room, stationery shop, and a photocopier, etc. Spread over twenty five acres of land, the College premises are housed in one of the prime locations of the North Campus of the University of Delhi, well connected by road and the Delhi Metro. The college campus is well known for its well-maintained gardens and lovely trees, a vast sports ground, and a men's hostel which can accommodate nearly 200 students. It also has one of the finest auditoria in Delhi, a state-of-the-art seminar room, and last but not the least, its very own canteen where the eatables can get as sumptuous as the discussions.

The College provides a liberal, lively and competitive environment enabling students to carve out a niche for themselves in their chosen arenas. Besides the infrastructural facilities, the strength of the College lies in its congenial and enriching atmosphere, which plays a crucial role in maintaining the excellent record the College is renowned for. Generations of students who have been groomed in this College have excelled in different walks of life, with the years spent in the College providing them a solid foundation on which they could craft their success. The College is committed to providing the leadership and direction for the times ahead in every sphere of human enterprise and endeavor.

Hindu College celebrated its centenary in February 1999, renewing its commitment to the values and goals that it was founded on, and has stood for, since its inception. As part of the centenary celebrations, the Distinguished Alumni Awards were instituted. Since then the Old Students Association (OSA), under the able leadership of its present President, Mr. Lalit Bhasin, an eminent lawyer, has been regularly conferring Distinguished Alumni Awards on those of its alumni who have made significant contributions in their fields. The OSA has evolved into a dynamic and vibrant body. It contributes actively towards the development and cultural activities of the college. The OSA has also begun a newsletter, giving details of its activities. In 2003-2004, the OSA instituted two additional awards, viz. **Lifetime Achievement Award** and **Young Achievers' Award**.

Recently, Hindu college has been awarded the "Star College" status under DBT (Department of Biotechnology), Ministry of Science and Technology, Government of India, in the year 2012. Under this scheme, the college will receive financial support for pursuit of research among the Physical and Biological Sciences. The College

also has bagged four innovative interdisciplinary research projects under the University of Delhi “Innovative Research Scheme-2012” to promote research at the undergraduate level. This involves the students and faculty of the Science Departments.

1. HUMANITIES AND SOCIAL SCIENCES

DEPARTMENT OF ECONOMICS

The Economics Department of Hindu College takes pride in being among the best Departments for the study of Economics at the undergraduate level. It comprises a young and dynamic faculty of eight members with diverse specializations and /or interests.

The teaching methodology combines standard methods of University education – lectures and tutorials - with written assignments, project work, field trips, and student presentations both in class and in seminars. In addition to the core papers that are taught (see www.du.ac.in for details), students can choose from among a number of optional courses in their final year. In the academic years 2008-09 and 2009-10, the Department has offered optional courses in Game Theory, International Economics, Public Economics, Money and Financial Markets, Econometrics, and Indian Agriculture and Industry. The Department also has an internship program and we encourage our students to participate in the corporate and research life of institutions outside college.

The Economics Society of the Department organizes a variety of events to promote students interest in the subject. These events include the Ranjan Roy Memorial Debate, O.P. Kaushik Memorial Lecture, and the Economics Festival “L’Economiste”. The Society also brings out an annual Economics magazine “Arth” to which faculty members, students, and professionals from related fields contribute articles.

All activities of the Department are aimed at encouraging the students to explore beyond the frontiers of the prescribed syllabus, evaluate economic issues using the skills and tools acquired both inside and outside the classroom, and interact with experts from diverse areas of specialization.

DEPARTMENT OF ENGLISH

The English Department is one of the oldest and most reputed Departments in Hindu College. Its reputation has been steadily enhanced over the years through the hard work of its faculty, which has traditionally combined excellence in research with a dedication to pedagogy. The faculty includes specialists in several areas of literary studies; for instance, European Renaissance Literature, Literature of the English Romantics, the Victorian Literature, Classic and Modern American Literature, Modern European Literature, Theatre and Film Studies, Popular Culture and Postcolonial Studies, Twentieth Century Indian Writing, Classic European and Indian Literature, and African and Canadian Studies.

Students admitted to the First Year of the B.A. (Hons.) Course in English are given a week-long series of orientation lectures initiating them to the various approaches and methodologies of literary studies. The overall performance of students of this Department has been consistently of a high standard.

The Department runs the English Literary Society which organizes various events including lectures and conferences through the academic year and places an emphasis on written work and discussion as crucial components of the learning process. The Seminar Library of the Department provides useful additional study material for its students.

The students of the Department also take an active interest in curricular and extra curricular activities. "FLARE", the annual short- story sampler, publishes stories submitted for the inter-college short-story competition, which has been held now for six years. A selection of some of the best stories has also been anthologised and published in the form of a book in 2008.

हिंदी विभाग

हिंदी विभाग इस महाविद्यालय व विश्वविद्यालय के सबसे पुराने एवं प्रतिष्ठित विभागों में से एक है, जिसमें स्नातक (B.A.Hons) और स्नातकोत्तर (M.A. Hindi) स्तर तक अध्यापन किया जाता है। विभाग की समृद्ध परम्परा को निर्मित करने में कई राष्ट्रीय एवं अंतर्राष्ट्रीय स्तर के विद्वान शिक्षकों की भूमिका उल्लेखनीय है, जिनमें डॉ दशरथ ओझा, डॉ भरत सिंह उपाध्याय, श्री कृष्ण शंकर शुक्ल, डॉ मांधाता ओझा, डॉ कृष्ण दत्त पालीवाल जैसे नाम प्रमुख हैं।

वर्तमान में विभाग में सात सदस्य हैं। इन सभी के सामूहिक प्रयास व कुशल निर्देशन में विभाग की सक्रियता व रचनाधर्मिता आकार पाती है। हिंदी प्रतिष्ठा स्नातक व स्नातकोत्तर के अध्ययन अध्यापन की विशिष्टता के लिए हिंदी विभाग की विलक्षण पहचान है। साहित्य के अध्ययन से जहां स्वयं, समाज, देश और दुनिया के बारे में संवेदनशील समझ विकसित होती है, वहीं हिंदी भाषा सृजनात्मक तौर पर तमाम व्यवसायों की भाषा के रूप में अपनी पहचान बना चुकी है।

विभाग में 150 से अधिक छात्र छात्राएं मुख्य विषय के रूप में हिंदी पढ रहे हैं। इसके अलावा बी.ए. (प्रोग्राम) में हिंदी 'ए' तथा 'बी', समवर्ती (कनकरेंट) विषय के रूप में हिंदी भाषा, साहित्य एवं संस्कृति, हिंदी क्रेडिट, रचनात्मक लेखन, आईडीसी (इंटरडिसिप्लनरी) इत्यादि के रूप में भी हिंदी पढाई जा रही है।

यहाँ से शिक्षा प्राप्त विद्यार्थी विभिन्न महाविद्यालयों तथा विश्वविद्यालयों में अध्यापन के अलावा प्रशासनिक सेवा, दृश्य श्रव्य मुद्रित मीडिया, कॉरपोरेट सेक्टर, दूतावास एवं भारतीय रंगमंच व सिनेमा के क्षेत्र में भी महत्वपूर्ण भूमिका निभा रहे हैं। राष्ट्रीय एवं अंतर्राष्ट्रीय स्तर पर भी हिंदी को स्थापित करने एवं उसके प्रचार प्रसार करने में भी यहाँ के छात्रों और शिक्षकों की भूमिका सराहनीय रही है।

विभाग की साहित्यिक संस्था 'हिंदी साहित्य सभा' की गरिमायुगी पहचान है। लगभग सभी क्षेत्रों के विशेषज्ञ इस मंच से संबोधित कर चुके हैं। इसके अंतर्गत वार्षिक उत्सव 'अभिधा' का आयोजन भी किया जाता है, जिसकी विश्वविद्यालय में विशिष्ट पहचान है। इसमें सृजनात्मक प्रतियोगिताओं के साथ साथ गंभीर साहित्यिक, सामाजिक, सांस्कृतिक मुद्दों पर गोष्ठी का आयोजन भी किया जाता है। भित्ति पत्रिका 'लहर' का संचालन सुचारू रूप से छात्रों द्वारा किया जाता है। बहुचर्चित हस्तलिखित पत्रिका 'हस्ताक्षर' ने विभाग की रचनाशीलता व बौद्धिकता को नया आयाम प्रदान किया है। विभाग की नाट्य संस्था 'अभिरंग' अपने छात्रों के लिए अभिनय व निर्देशन का मंच मुहैया कराती है। अब तक कई नाटकों (कबिरा खड़ा बाज़ार में, चरणदास चोर, प्रेम कथा पंचतंत्र से, बकरी इत्यादि) का मंचन किया गया, जिन्हें अपार प्रशंसा मिली। साक्षर होने के बजाय शिक्षित होने के सपने देखने वाले युवाओं का विभाग स्वागत करता है।

DEPARTMENT OF HINDI

The Hindi Department is one of the most reputed Departments of undergraduate and postgraduate studies in the University and one of the oldest Departments of the College.

The Department has a glorious past. Renowned scholars of national and international repute like Dr. Dashrath Ojha, Dr. Bharat Singh Upadhyay and Shri Krishan Shankar Shukla have been on its faculty. More recently, it had writers and critics like Dr. Mandhata Ojha, Dr. Krishna Dutt Paliwal and Dr. Suresh Rituparna and Dr. Harish Naval of national repute.

Besides teaching in Universities, colleges and schools, alumni of the Department have distinguished themselves in a variety of other professions like Administrative Services, Print and Visual Media, in the corporate sector, embassies, and in Indian Cinema and Theatre. The faculty and alumni of the Department have also consistently played a prominent role in the promotion of Hindi at the International level.

More than one hundred and fifty students study Hindi as their main subject at graduate and post-graduate levels. Hindi is also taught as a subject in the B.A. Programme course and as a concurrent/Interdisciplinary course for the other B.A. (Hons.) courses. Students of the Department have consistently secured top positions in the University examinations.

The Department has a very reputed literary society named 'Hindi Sahitya Sabha', under whose aegis, lectures by eminent experts are organized. Students also arrange and conduct other functions under the 'Hindi Sahitya Sabha'. The students themselves put up a Wall Magazine 'LAHAR' regularly. The Department also organizes an annual festival "ABHIDHA".

The Department has a Dramatics Society named 'ABHIRANG'. It has organized many theatre workshops with the help of National School of Drama and Sahitya Kala Parishad. It has produced many full length plays including 'KABIRA KHADA BAZAR MEIN', 'CHARAN DAS CHOR' and 'PREM KATHA: PANCHTANTRON SE', 'MOTERAM KA SATYAGRAHA', 'BAKAREE', 'TERI MERI USKI BAAT', and 'KOLAVERIDI-AISI BHI'. The shows of these plays were conducted in different parts of India. The Department also brings out a popular acclaimed magazine titled as 'HASTAKSHAR', which not only adds vitality to the creative and intellectual space of the campus, but also provides a platform for the students and teachers to hone their creative skill. The magazine deals with a range of literary and topical issues and endeavors to revive the forgotten art of penmanship.

DEPARTMENT OF HISTORY

History is one of the oldest disciplines taught at Hindu College. Its students are drawn from all over the country and have over the year's attained distinction in different spheres ranging from research, social analysis, law, administrative services to films. DEPARTMENT OF BOTANY

The Department of Botany has since its inception grown in stature and standard. It has a qualified faculty of seven teachers who, besides teaching, have also been pursuing research. The major areas of their Current research interests include Electron Microscopy, Stain Technology, Reproductive Biology, Ecology, Plant Pathology, Cellular and Molecular Cytogenetics, Phycology, Applied Microbiology and Biotechnology. The teachers have published over 110 research papers in journals of national and international repute. They have, in addition, authored/edited a number of books/course materials for CBSE and NCERT. In the last 15 years, the faculty members of the Department have conducted a number of research projects sponsored by UGC and DST. The projects undertaken have not only improved the laboratory, but also led to greater orientation towards fields of applied research. In keeping with the high quality of research work, the bio-data of one of the teachers has been incorporated into the "Who's Who in World"- a catalogue biography of scientists of international repute published by Marquis Who's Who, New Jersey, U.S.A. Invitations to memberships of learned societies, like the New York Academy of Sciences, have also been received.

With an efficient teaching staff, helpful and co-operative non-teaching staff, the Department has attracted students from various places within and outside India. Every year the Department selects meritorious students for admission to the 1st year of B.Sc. (Hons.). Its alumni have distinguished themselves as teachers and scientists in academic and research organizations, government scientific Departments and corporate bodies.

The Department has facilities to cater to the needs of the students. It has a collection of rare books donated by the late Professor Manohar Lal, former Head of the Department of Botany, Delhi University. The Hindu College Botanical Society—"Sanjeevani" arranges field excursions and lectures by distinguished botanists. During the annual festival- "Inflorescence", quiz, rangoli and other contests are organised to widen the horizon of students with enhanced awareness of the world around them.

III. EXAMINATION RESULTS

IV. ADMISSION

There are two modes of admission of eligible candidates to any of the courses of study as per the details given below:

(i) Direct Admission:

Admission to the first year of the following courses is made directly by the college.

- a) B.A. Programme
- b) B.A. (Honours) in Economics / Hindi / Sanskrit / Sociology /History / Political Science / Philosophy/ English
- c) B. Com (Honours)
- d) B. Sc. Physical Sciences (Chemistry)
- e) B. Sc. Physical Sciences (Electronics)
- f) B. Sc. (Honours) in Physics / Chemistry / Botany / Zoology / Mathematics / Statistics

(ii) Admission through Faculties of Arts/Science/Commerce :

Admission to the 1st year of the following courses is made through the respective faculties in the University of Delhi:

- a) B.A. (Honours) Music through Faculty of Arts
- b) M.A. through Faculty of Arts
- c) M.Sc. through Faculty of Science / Mathematical Science
- d) M. Com through Faculty of Commerce

Candidates desirous of seeking admission to any of the above mentioned courses need to first get themselves registered with the respective faculty. The college will then receive applications only from those candidates who have been registered by the concerned faculty.

Admissions to Under-Graduate Courses:

Candidates desirous of seeking admission to the course of their choice need to apply on the prescribed Pre-Admission form, which would be available at the University counter from 4th June, 2012. (No preadmission form in any format (Physical or online) is required to be filled in by the students for admission purposes. The college shall convey to the University the cut-off marks for the various courses (for General, SC/ST and OBC categories), as per the schedule announced by the University.

After declaration of the cut-offs lists by the University, the student will need to report to the college for admission within a stipulated period. At this stage, the student would be required to fill the college admission forms and the University enrolment form. The student would then get his/her documents verified and pay the admission the fees.

In courses where admissions are done through entrance examinations, separate procedure shall apply.

Students, who wish to be considered in the Sports and Extra-Curricular Activities (ECA) categories, may have to fill separate ECA/Sport forms. The application forms shall be made available by the college. Similarly, the candidates desirous of availing of **Hostel Accomodation** need to apply on the prescribed form issued by the college.

Admission of SC / ST / PH / OBC Candidates:

The admission of the candidates belonging to SC/ST categories and the physically challenged candidates is done through the University of Delhi. Such candidates are therefore advised to refer to the Information Bulletin of the University for further details. As regards the admission of the candidates belonging to the OBC category the relevant guidelines from the University of Delhi will be applicable.

Qualifying Criteria for Admission:

Only the candidates who would have applied for admission as per the admission schedule (Annexure- I) notified by the University of Delhi will be considered for admission, provided they meet the qualifying cut-off percentage for the respective courses of study as notified by the college.

1. The first admissions list, and any subsequent lists if necessary, will be put up on the college notice board on the dates announced by University of Delhi for the same.

2. Candidates who qualify according to the criteria stated therein and have also applied for admission, or those whose admission under any reserved category has been recommended by the appropriate authority, will be first required to report to the Admission In-charge of the concerned course in the room designated for that purpose. The candidate must report in person, between 10 a.m. and 12.30 p.m. on the days fixed for admission and payment of fees, for the relevant admission list. The candidate must carry the following documents in original and one self attested copy of each of the following:

- a. Provisional Certificate from the Principal of the School / College last attended.
- b. Certificate of Date of Birth (Issued by the concerned Board).
- c. Detailed Marks-Sheet (of Senior School Certificate, or equivalent examination)

[Note: Candidates whose qualifying examination is from a Board other than the C.B.S.E. or C.I.S.C.E. (ISC Examination) must get their result authenticated by the Resident Commissioner of the State where the Board is situated. All students who are covered under this clause must comply with this within the time limit for admission.]

d. Two self-attested recent passport size photographs (of the candidate).

e. SC/ST/OBC certificate or Certificate of disability, issued by a competent authority and admission slip issued by the University (in case of admissions in SC/ST/PH categories). It may be noted that if any false attestation / falsified record are detected, the students will be declared debarred from attending any course in the

University or College(s) for the next five years and in addition, a criminal case under the relevant section of IPC (viz. 470, 471, 474 IPC etc.) will be instituted against the student.

3. After obtaining the recommendation of the Admission In-charge of the concerned course, the candidate will report to the Central Admission Committee (CAC) with all the documents, and follow the subsequent instructions issued to him/her by the Committee.

4. After obtaining the approval of the CAC, the candidate will be required to deposit the fee within the specified time.

5. Candidates who have passed their qualifying examination in any year other than 2012 may be considered separately on an individual basis.

Note : Students admitted to the College will be bound by the Admission Rules and Regulations of the College and the University.

2. Students admitted on the basis of extra-curricular activities are required to participate in such activities as are organized by the College from time to time, failing which their admission is liable to be cancelled.

EXAMINATIONS RECOGNISED BY THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

Candidates seeking admission to undergraduate courses of the University of Delhi must have passed one of the following or any equivalent examinations:

(i) Senior School Certificate (12 years) Examination of the Central Board of Secondary Education, New Delhi, or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto **OR** Pre-University Examination (2 years after ten years schooling) of an Indian University recognized by the University of Delhi **OR** Intermediate Examination (or Pre-medical Examination in case of science courses) of an Indian University/ Board or an examination recognized as equivalent thereto.

(ii) Indian School Certificate Examination (12 years) conducted by the Council for the Indian School Certificate Examination, New Delhi.

(iii) General Certificate Education Examination of the United Kingdom, with (a) Pass marks in five subjects at Ordinary Level and (b) At least in two subjects at Advanced Level. The two advanced level courses may be chosen either from among the five Ordinary Level subjects or from outside this group as prescribed by the University of Delhi.

[Wherever G.C.E. Certificate indicates the grades, they will be treated at par with the grades of Indian School Certificate Examination for purpose of admission requirements.]

Note : Applications for admission of candidates belonging to examination bodies other than those listed above shall not be entertained by the College without production of an **ELIGIBILITY CERTIFICATE** issued by the University of Delhi.

MIGRATION CERTIFICATE

Candidates who have passed their last examination from a Board or a University outside Delhi will be required to submit their Migration Certificate from that Board or University latest by the 15th October, 2012. Failure to do so may result in their admission being cancelled without any further notice to them.

SPECIFIC ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS

The minimum eligibility requirements for admission to various Under-Graduate courses, as laid down by the University of Delhi, are given below. Candidates may note that these are only minimum eligibility conditions and their satisfaction does not guarantee admission.

(i) Admission to B.A. Programme / B.Sc. Physical Sciences (Chemistry) and B.Sc. Physical Sciences (Electronics)

Minimum percentage of marks required for admission to B.A. Programme is 40% in the aggregate in any of the examinations recognised by the University of Delhi.

Minimum percentage of marks required for admission to B.Sc. Physical Sciences (Chemistry) and B.Sc. Physical Sciences (Electronics) Courses is 45% in the aggregate of Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, and passing in one compulsory language (i.e. English), in any of the examinations recognised by the University of Delhi.

(ii) Admission to B.A.(Hons.) /B.Com. (Hons.)

Minimum percentage of marks for admission to a B.A.(Hons.)/B.Com.(Hons.) Course is 45% in the aggregate in any of the examinations recognised by the University of Delhi.

In addition, candidates who have passed the Intermediate Examination of an Indian University/Board with at least 40% marks in the aggregate and also one of the following examinations, shall be eligible for admission to the courses indicated in brackets alongside.

(a) Prabhakar Examination {for B.A. (Hons.) Hindi}.

(b) Shastri Examination {for B.A. (Hons.) Sanskrit}

(iii) Admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) Courses

Minimum percentage of marks, in any of the examinations recognised by the University of Delhi, required:

A) 55% marks in the aggregate of three subjects including Physics, Chemistry and also

(i) Biology (for admission to B. Sc. (Hons.) Botany/Zoology); and

(ii) Mathematics (for admission to B. Sc. (Hons.) Physics/Chemistry) and passing in one compulsory language (i.e. English).

B) 50% marks in Mathematics and 45% marks in the aggregate of one language and three best elective subjects (out of Mathematics, Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Agriculture, Engineering Drawing, Geography, Computer Science, Economics and Home Science) - for admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) Course in Mathematics.

C) 50% marks in Mathematics and 45% marks in the aggregate, for admission to B.Sc. (Hons.) Statistics

DETAILS OF COURSES OF STUDY

All the undergraduate degree courses shall be taught in semester mode in the academic session 2012-13.

1. B.Sc. Physical Sciences (Electronics) and (Chemistry)

The subjects to be studied are Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics, Environmental Science, Computational Skills and English for B.Sc Physical Science (Chemistry) students.

B.Sc Physical Science (Electronics) students will study Physics, Electronics, Biology, Mathematics, Environmental Science, Computational Skills and English.

Admissions will be based on merit to be determined from marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

2. B.Sc. (Hons.):

(i) Chemistry

B.Sc. (Hons.) Chemistry is an integrated course. Admissions are based on merit to be determined from marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

(ii) Physics

B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics is an integrated course. Admissions are based on merit to be determined from marks in Physics, Chemistry and Mathematics.

(iii) Mathematics

Mathematics is the main subject to be studied along with three courses from disciplines other than Mathematics. Admissions are based on merit to be determined by marks in English + Mathematics + Two subjects from the academic stream as mentioned in the University bulletin with a minimum of 90% of marks in Mathematics in class XII.

Along with Mathematics papers, a student will have to opt for 4 credit courses from disciplines other than mathematics and a qualifying paper. A student will, have to choose one course each from credit-I in Semester I, Credit course-II in Semester-II and qualifying course in Semester-III. A student will have to opt for 2 courses from credit-III as credit-III .1 and credit course-III.2 in VI and IV Semesters, respectively. In those subjects where more than one course is offered the student will opt for one of the courses. But if a student opts for physics –II, he/she may opt for physics (lab). The marks of the credit course-I, II, III.1 and III .2 shall count in the final result of the student.

- Every student must opt for at least one language. It can either be a credit course or a qualifying course. If they are opting for a language in both the credit as well as the qualifying course then these cannot be the same languages.
- A student offering Chemistry / Physics-I as credit course-I will not be allowed to offer the same as Credit course –II
- A student offering Chemistry / Physics-I as credit course-I can opt for Chemistry (Lab) / Physics (Lab) as credit course–II but they cannot opt for these courses as qualifying courses.
- A student will be allowed to take Chemistry (Lab) / Physics (Lab) as qualifying course if they have opted for Chemistry / Physics-I, respectively as credit course.

(iv) Statistics

B.Sc. (Hons.) Statistics is an integrated course. Admissions are based on merit determined on the basis of the marks in the best four subjects according to the following criteria

Category A: (Mathematics + English + two best subjects) from Science stream (Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Computer Science, Biotechnology and Economics).

Category B: (Mathematics + English + two best subjects) /Commerce streams (Economics, Business studies, Accountancy and Commerce)

Category C: (Mathematics + one language + two elective / Academic subjects).

(v) Botany

Botany is the main subject, with Chemistry, Maths, Computational skills and English as the other subjects.

Admissions are based on merit to be determined from marks in Biology / Biotechnology, Physics, and Chemistry.

(vi) Zoology

Zoology is the main subject, with Chemistry, Maths, Computational skills and English as the other subjects.

Admissions are based on merit to be determined from marks in Biology / Biotechnology, Physics, and Chemistry.

3. B.Com. (Hons.)

- The candidate must have studied and secured a minimum of 60% marks in English and Mathematics for all the categories, to become eligible for admission to this course.

Note:

- (a) The college has facility for instruction only in English. Certain level of proficiency is therefore, needed in the language.
- (b) Study of Maths is fundamental to the understanding of various papers of the honors course.
- The cut-off percentage will be expressed as X% and above in all the lists thereby keeping open the previous lists also.

- For course details as applicable for academic year 2012-13, refer to the official website of the Department of Commerce, University of Delhi.
- Regarding the optional papers, Commerce Department of Hindu College will have the discretion to decide about the same.

The students will be divided into three categories below:

Category A: For students who have studied the following subjects:

- English-Core, Functional, Elective
- Maths- Mathematics, Advanced maths, Business maths (as allowed by the University).
- Commerce / Businesses Studies
- Accountancy
- Economics

The best four will be determined on the basis of English and any three of the remaining subjects (2, 3, 4, 5) listed above subject to the same percentage in Accountancy as the main cut-off percentage.

Category B: For students who have studied the following subjects:

- English
- Maths
- Physics
- Chemistry
- Biology

The best four will be determined on the basis of English and any three of the remaining subjects (2, 3, 4, 5) listed above. A differential of 2.5% will be observed vis-a-vis category A.

Category C: For students who have studied English and Mathematics with three academic subjects, the best four will be determined on the basis of any one language (MIL), and any three of the remaining academic subjects excluding:

- Physical Education
- Music
- Dance
- Home Science
- Engineering Drawing
- Fine arts
- Agriculture

A differential of 3% will be observed vis-a-vis category A.

4. B.A. (Hons.) Humanities and Social Sciences

Students offering B.A. (Hons.) courses will study their main subject along with concurrent courses. These Concurrent / Discipline Centered courses have four components:

- Language Credit Course: The College offers English, Hindi and Sanskrit.
- Qualifying Course: The College offers English, Hindi, Sanskrit and Philosophy.
- The Interdisciplinary Courses:
 - Philosophy Department: Ethics in the Public Domain
 - History Department: Environmental Issues in India
 - Political Science Department: Reading Gandhi
 - English Department: The Individual and Society

OR

- (e) Hindi Department: Hindi Language, Literature, and Culture
- (f) Sociology Department: Gender and Society
- (g) Mathematics Department: Mathematical Awareness
- (i) Sanskrit Department: Nationalism and Indian literature

Note : Individual Departments are responsible for administering the course. Teachers from other Departments can contribute to the teaching of the course, if needed.

Note : The actual courses to be taught shall be decided by the respective Departments.

* In the first year, a student shall offer (i), (ii) and (iii).

* In the second year, a student shall offer two Discipline Centered courses.

* The marks of the qualifying subjects shall not be counted in the final result.

(i) English

The main subject in English is Literature and the following Concurrent Courses are available:

Admission to the B.A. (Hons.) English course will be done through a **Combined Aptitude Test for English (CATE)**, to be held under the aegis of the Department of English, University of Delhi. The test will evaluate candidates' aptitude for the course.

The test will be held on 5th June, 2011.

The criteria for appearing in the test will be:

- (i) A minimum of 60% marks in English (Functional, Core, Elective, etc) in the school-leaving (Class XII) examination, AND
- (ii) A minimum of 60% aggregate in the best 4 subjects (including English).

The CATE score will be calculated on a 30:70 ratio of the class XII aggregate marks: CATE marks.

SC/ST/PH/Foreign students will be admitted as per the rules of the University. Relaxation for Armed Forces personnel will be as per University rules. Such students will have to appear for the CATE. OBC students will be given up to a maximum relaxation of 10 on their CATE cut-off score, as determined by the 29 respective colleges, at the time of admission only.

Colleges will admit students from the CATE score list on the basis of cut-offs fixed by them respectively. There will be no centralised allocation of candidates to the different colleges by the University.

For more details, please consult the CATE information booklet, which is available, along with the application form, at the admission counters of the CATE-participating colleges.

(ii) Economics

Economics is the main subject to be studied along with the concurrent courses.

Admission Criteria

Admission to the B.A. (Hons) course in Economics will be based on merit determined according to the averages percentage secured in the Class XII Examination in a combination of four subjects, with the subject combination defined by any of the following three categories:

Category A: One MIL, Mathematics/Business Mathematics, and any two Commerce subjects

Category B: One MIL, Mathematics/Business Mathematics, and any two Science subjects (1% lower than category A)

Category C: One MIL, Mathematics/Business Mathematics, and any two Humanities subjects (2% lower than Category A)

Category D: One MIL, Mathematics/Business Mathematics, and any two elective subjects (1% higher than Category A)

- The cut-off for respective categories will be intimated at the time of admission according to University calendar.
- The cut-off for OBC categories will be lower than the General category cut-off for categories A, B, C and D and the difference will be intimated at the time of admission according to the University calendar.
- All four subjects shall be given equal weightage in determining a candidate's average percentage.
- A candidate must have secured at least 60% marks in English in the Class XII Examination to be eligible for admission.
- The one Language that shall be considered would ordinarily be English or Hindi (Official Indian Languages of different states other than Hindi may be considered in cases where the candidate has studied the language in Class X and Class XII).
- The specific subjects that a candidate can consider as "Commerce", "Science" and "Humanities" in categories A, B and C respectively, and as "any two elective subjects" in category D will be determined as per University guidelines at the time of admission.

(iii) History

History is the main subject to be studied along with the concurrent courses. Admissions shall be done strictly on merit under the following categories:

Category A: One Language + History and Two Other Social Sciences Subjects.

Category B: One Languages and Three Social Sciences Subjects.

Category C: One Language and Three Science / Commerce Stream Subjects.

Category D: One Language and any Three academic Subjects.

Note: Over many years the Department has noted that candidates with social science subjects do not acquire as many marks as the candidates with Science/Commerce streams. Therefore due weightage is given to the candidates, with social science subjects rather than to the Science/Commerce subjects. The difference of percentage between category A&B will be of two percent i.e. Category B will be kept higher by 2% than Category A. Category C will be higher by 6% than Category A while the last Category D would be higher by 8% than Category A. This is same as the last year i.e. 2011-2012.

(iv) Philosophy

Philosophy is the main subject to be studied along with the concurrent courses. Admissions to B. A. Honours in Philosophy will be done on the basis of merit as per the Categories drawn up by the Department of Philosophy. The College has facility for instruction only in English. Hence, proficiency in written and spoken English is required.

Category A: One Language + Three Humanities/Social Science Subjects; Hindi Core, English Core, English Elective, and Other Languages. **Academic Subjects:** English Elective, Philosophy, Mathematics, Economics, Political Science, History, Geography, Fine Arts, Sociology, Psychology.

Category B: One Language + Three Science/Commerce Stream Subjects. **Academic Subjects:** Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Mathematics, Biotechnology, Psychology, Computer Science, Informatics Practices, Economics, Business Studies and Accountancy.

Category C: One Language + any Three Subjects from the academic stream.

Category A would be the privileged Category as students with Humanities/Social Science background fair well in Philosophy. There would be a difference of 3% between Category A and Category B, while Category C students would be required to have 5% higher marks than Category A Students.

The Department of Philosophy offers the following Concurrent Courses for the following year 2012-13.

1. Ethics in the Public Domain (Concurrent Language Qualifying Course for Semester-I students)
2. Ethics in the Public Domain (Concurrent Interdisciplinary course for semester –III Students)
3. Formal Logic (Concurrent Discipline centered course for Semester –IV students) N.B.: Due to the large number of students opting for this course, it is taught to three batches of students simultaneously.

(v) Political Science

Political Science is the main subject to be studied along with the concurrent courses.

Category A: One language + Political Science + any other two social science subjects.

Category B: One language + any three social science subjects.

Category C: One language + any three subjects from science/commerce streams.

Category D: One language + any other combination of three academic subjects (The list of academic subjects is as per the Information bulletin of the University of Delhi)

(vi) Hindi

Hindi is the main subject to be studied along with the concurrent courses. All candidates who have passed their Class XII examinations with Hindi as one of the subject shall be eligible for admission to B.A. (Hons.) Hindi based on merit in the categories given below:

Category A: For Art Stream: Hindi + any three Social Science Subjects

Category B: For Science / Commerce Stream: 5% higher than Category A.

(vii) Sanskrit

Sanskrit is the main subject to be studied along with the Concurrent Courses. Selection for admission to B.A. (Hons.) Sanskrit will be made from among those students who have studied Sanskrit up to Class X and XII.

(viii) Sociology

Sociology is the main subject to be studied along with the Concurrent Courses. The College has facility for instruction only in English. Proficiency in spoken and written English is a must. Admission shall be done strictly on merit under the following categories:

Category A: One language + Sociology + any Two elective subjects (3% less than category B)

Category B: One language + any Three elective subjects (3% more than Category-A)

The Department of Sociology offers the following Concurrent Courses for the following year 2012-13.

1. Gender and Society (Semester-III students)
2. Sociology of Contemporary India (Semester –IV Students)

(ix) Music

The candidates desirous of seeking admission to B.A. (H) Music need to contact the Faculty of Music / Fine Arts University of Delhi, for relevant details. The College merely enrolls the candidates for the said course only after the registration of eligible candidates is done by the Faculty.

5. B.A. (Programme)

Admission to this course will be on the basis of both merit and sports/extra-curricular activities. Admission shall be done under the following categories

Category A: One language + three social science subjects. (4% less than category B.)

Category B: One language + any three academic subjects. (4% more than category A) The structure of B.A. Programme is as follows :

First year: Two Language courses.

- The College offers English, Hindi (or Philosophy in case of those who have not studied Hindi at Class X or Class XII level) and Sanskrit.
- Two Discipline Courses from (i) Economics (ii) History (iii) Political Science (iv) Sanskrit (v) Philosophy (vi) Elective English (This is applicable for both Semester 1 and Semester 2)

Second year: One Language

- One Foundation Course *
- Two Discipline Courses (Continuing from First Year)
- The College has decided to offer two Foundation Courses out of which the students have to select any one.
- They are:
 - (a) Human Rights, Gender and Environment
 - (b) Language, Literature and Culture (both in Hindi and English Medium).

Third year: One Language

- Two Discipline Courses (Continuing from First and Second Years)
- One Application Course from:
 - (a) Disaster Management
 - (b) Computer Applications
 - (c) Creative Writing

Note: * The College reserves the right to change the subject combinations if necessary.

6. M.A., M.Sc., M.Com.

- The College enrolls students for the following Post-Graduate Courses:
English, Hindi, Economics, Sanskrit, Political Science, Philosophy, History, Statistics, Commerce, Operational Research and Mathematics.
- The number of seats for the Post-Graduate Courses in Physics, Chemistry, Botany and Zoology are fixed by the University of Delhi. Admission in all courses is made in order of merit as per lists brought out by the University.

REMEDIAL TEACHING

The College has been organising Remedial Coaching classes for the SC/ST students for all the Under-Graduate Courses from the beginning of each academic session. Any student can get herself/himself enrolled for these classes with the respective department. These classes are held in the afternoon for the students of the categories mentioned in order to remove their specific problems.

CANCELLATION OF ADMISSION AND REFUND OF FEES

A student who wishes to get his/her admission cancelled must apply in prescribed form to the Principal with his/her application countersigned by his/her guardian/parent. Refund of fee will be made as per University of Delhi rules. In case a student drops out without such a formal withdrawal, his/her security deposit refund will be made in accordance with the University of Delhi rules.

As per present Delhi University Rules, the following deduction will be made:

V. HOSTEL

Hostels in academic institutions are the epicenter of the dynamics of the campus life. Spread over vast area and surrounded by green cover, encompassing gardens, inside and outside lawns, Hindu College Hostel, for over a half century has been providing fuel and force to the life and motion of College's liberal democratic academic culture. Hindu College Hostel, with its architectural grandeur and aesthetics, has been an abode to many luminaries in a wonderful kaleidoscope that the time-space spectrum is.

Situated next to the sports complex, the Hostel is a spacious structure with 119 rooms enclosing eight lawns with rose beds and hedges. The Hostel provides residential facilities to about two hundred undergraduate and postgraduate male students. The Common Room provides the residents recreational facilities such as Table-tennis, Carom-board, Chess-board, and a separate TV room apart from the newspapers and magazines to keep them on the *qui vive*.

Admissions are strictly on the basis of merit and the resident students are expected to maintain the spirit of camaraderie and dignity. The guiding principle for the Hindu College community has been to uphold democratic and egalitarian values and strive towards intellectual excellence.

Administration

The Hostel is managed by the Hostel Committee which is constituted by the Staff Council of the College and executed by the Warden in consultation with the Principal. **Mr. Chandrachur Singh, Assistant Professor in the Department of Political Science is the current Warden.**

The Hostel Office and the Warden's Residence, located within the Hostel premises, are integral part of the Hostel. There are several employees to look after the daily chores in the hostel. They include an office clerk, a mess manager, mess/room bearers, cooks, watchmen, janitors, gardener and a few others for kitchen and pantry work. In addition, there is a dry cleaner and a newspaper vendor to provide services to the resident students. The health services are made available to the residents by the WUS Health Center located within the University Campus.

ADMISSION

- All prospective candidates are required to procure the Hostel Handbook of Information for new admission and/or readmission every year, by filling in and submitting the Application Form appended to the Hostel Prospectus.
- All admissions to the Hostel are made strictly on the basis of merit. Only those students, who do not have their immediate family members residing within the radius of 30 kms of the College (as the crow flies) are eligible for admission.
- Once admitted to the College eligible students can apply for a seat in the Hostel *however*, the allocations ***for the academic year 2012-13 shall be made in the month of October 2012.***
- The applicant must attach the following documents (Photocopy) with the application form:
 1. Fee Receipt issued by Hindu College Accounts Office.
 2. Date of Birth Certificate.
 3. XII Class Mark Sheet.
 4. Residence Proof.
 5. SC/ ST certificate or Certificate of Disability as the case may be.
 6. Three self attested passport size photograph.
 7. Two self addressed stamped envelops.
- Short listed candidates must be accompanied by their Parents/Local Guardians for necessary interview with the Warden/Hostel Committee at the time of admission. A Local Guardian should be someone who holds a responsible position in an organization and/or possesses an authentic authorization from the Parents of the prospective resident. In no case the Local guardian shall be a student.
- Candidates selected for admission to the Hostel shall be required to pay the Hostel fees by way of Demand Draft within the date and time stipulated in this regard. Demand draft should be drawn in favour of the Principal, Hindu College, and payable at Delhi. If the fees are not paid in the manner and by the date and time specified in this regard, any claim to admission to the Hostel shall stand automatically forfeited.
- **The students are required to submit a Residence Certificate from a Magistrate/ Resident Commissioner as a proof of permanent address at the time of their admission to the Hostel.**

- In case a student changes his course of study at any point of time after being admitted to the Hostel, his admission to the Hostel shall stand cancelled. He has to compete afresh with others in the new subject category to re-enter the Hostel, provided seats are available.
- In case a resident fails in his University Examination and/or becomes an ex-student of the College, he will lose his Hostel allotment. Subsequently, upon passing, he will not get back his Hostel seat automatically. Instead, he has to compete afresh for admission through the new merit list for his batch. Only those students whose re- evaluation result certifies promotion will be given automatic re-admission.
- After the successful completion of each academic year by the University of Delhi residents are re- admitted provided

(a) The resident has shown good behavior in the preceding year;

(b) The resident has secured a minimum of 55% in the case of being a Science/Commerce student and 50% in case of being a student from the Humanities/Arts stream.

(c) The resident has had a minimum of 66% attendance in the preceding year.

- Suspension/Expulsion order can be implemented with regard to any resident at any point of time on the grounds such as violation of College/Hostel/ University Rules and regulations, Non-payment of dues, etc.

For details of the rules regulations and the fee structure please refer to the Handbook of Information of the Hindu college Hostel

VI. LIBRARY

Hindu College Library is one of the oldest among Delhi University college libraries. It came into existence along with the foundation of the college in 1899. Hindu College Library is fully Air conditioned and computerized. The library is open to bonafide students of all the classes. All important textbooks are kept in the Reserve Section to enable the students to write their tutorials. There is a well equipped Reading Room, which subscribes to a large number of dailies, weeklies, periodicals and journals on a variety of subjects.

The library helps in providing photocopies of articles/text to students and staff members from documents available in the library. For this purpose user may get the desired document issued against his/her library card and return the same immediately after getting it photocopied from the vendor.

New Arrival Display Service

Books newly added to the library are displayed on the New Arrival Display Rack before they are released for loan.

Reservation of Book(s)

Books in great demand and which generally remain under issue can be reserved by user on the circulation counter.

OPAC Service

The OPAC allows you search for an item of your choice in Library holdings by Author, Title, and Keyword etc.

Internet Access

Eight Computer Terminals have been placed for users for accessing Internet and 4000 E-Journals (approximately).

VII . STUDENT ACTIVITIES / ENGAGEMENTS

Hindu College is amongst the pioneers in the country in associating students with day-to-day activities of the institution.

MAGAZINE

The College magazine, "INDRAPRASTHA", publishes articles by students and reports of the educational, cultural, social and sports activities of the College. Each section of the magazine is edited by a Student Editor under the supervision of a member of the teaching staff.

THE COLLEGE PARLIAMENT

The Hindu College Parliament is a unique student organisation in the country. All the students and teachers of the College are its members. The students elect the Prime Minister from amongst themselves at the beginning of the year. There is also a Leader of the Opposition. The Speaker of the Parliament is a teacher nominated by the Principal in his/her capacity as the President of the Hindu College Republic.

The College Parliament is a forum for discussions on academic and other issues. It is an excellent training ground for public speaking and leadership qualities. It allocates funds to the various societies.

JOINT CONSULTATIVE COMMITTEE (JCC)

The Joint Consultative Committee, consisting of representatives of students and teachers from different departments is the main consultative body for all important matters concerning the curricular and extra-curricular activities in the College. It meets frequently with the Principal in the Chair.

SPORTS

The College maintains an extensive and excellent playground and a Sports Complex. Cricket, Table Tennis, Lawn Tennis and Basket-ball events are organized in the college under the direct supervision of the Director of Physical Education.

NATIONAL SERVICE SCHEME (NSS)

The College has an active and vibrant NSS unit, which facilitates the participation of students in social work.

NATIONAL CADET CORPS (NCC)

The college has an NCC wing for the students. It is associated with the Delhi Naval Unit and offers training to students in personality development. The students will have to participate in adventure camps and also will be assigned duties for the Republic and Independence Day parades. On the successful completion of 'C' certificate, the students are entitled to exemption from written examination for officer's jobs in the Defence Services. They will get added benefit in marks in their final percentage too.

All outgoing students are requested to enroll themselves as members of the Old Students' Association of the College. The enrolment fee is Rs. 100/-, the annual membership fee is Rs. 250/- and life membership fee is Rs. 3000/-. All the teachers of the College are ex-officio members of the Association.

VIII . COUNSELLING AND PLACEMENT CELL

- **FRIENDS CORNER - THE COUNSELLING CELL**, recognizes all students as a valuable "Human Resource". It organizes Interactive Workshops that provide a platform for the students to voice their opinions and discuss topics which interest or concern them. The idea is to spread awareness on key issues, infuse a sense of responsibility and empower the students so that they become responsible, confident and independent individuals, with high levels of self-esteem. Thus, FRIENDS CORNER aims to promote a general feeling of "well-being" among the students and offers personal counseling, if desired, so as to encourage and motivate them to help themselves become efficient and effective individuals
- **DISHA -THE PLACEMENT CELL**, while stressing the need for further academic endeavour, provides the students with an opportunity to work, if they so desire. The cell organizes Seminars and Workshops on career-related matters and conducts Placement Sessions from time to time. The organizations that participated in the Placement Programme in the previous years are Google, Deloitte, HDFC, KPMG, Maruti, Jaypee, Ernst & Young, Protiviti, DE Shaw, Essar, Royal Sundaram Alliance, etc.
- Students have to get themselves enrolled as members.
- **WOMEN'S DEVELOPMENT CELL**

Women's Development Cell (WDC) of the college plays an active role in making the students aware of the problems faced by women and suggest ways and methods for their development in society. WDC sensitizes the college community on issues pertaining to women's rights, gender parity and empowerment. The cell takes the initiative in organising seminars, workshops, debates, street plays, film screening etc. WDC welcomes both girls and boys as members.

IX. ATTENDANCE AND DISCIPLINE

Teaching for all classes shall commence from July 2012 as per the academic calendar of the University of Delhi. Except on holidays, and during vacations, teaching (lectures, tutorials/preceptorials) will take place on six days every week from Monday to Saturday according to a notified weekly timetable for each course. Practicals will take place on six days of the week, from Monday to Saturday.

The University will announce the schedule for the Annual University Examinations for all classes. Students should however note that as per the decisions of the University of Delhi, with effect from the academic year 2003-2004, **25% of the marks in each course would be awarded to students on the basis of Internal Assessment. (Please refer to Ordinance VIII-E of the University of Delhi)**

IDENTITY CARD

Every student of the college is issued an Identity Card which he/she is expected to carry with him/her at all times. He/She will have to produce it whenever demanded. Students should collect their new Identity Cards at the beginning of the new academic session. The Identity Card must be surrendered at the time of leaving the College.

In case of loss of Identity Card, a duplicate card can be issued from the office on payment of Rs. 50/-. For this, the student shall first lodge an FIR at a Police Station.

ATTENDANCE RULES

In order to be eligible to appear at a University Examination every student has to attend a minimum of two third of the total number of lectures delivered at the college in all subjects as also in Tutorials/Preceptorials, as the case may be, taken separately in each Semester. **The University Ordinance VII, Clause 2-A, Part (ii) states that the College shall have power to strike off the name of a student who is irregular in attendance or when the absence of the student is for such a long period that he/she cannot put in the requisite percentage of attendance. These rules are strictly followed.** Parents/ Guardians are advised to periodically meet teachers of their wards to know the progress of their ward in studies and punctuality in attending classes.

Note: Late admission, if granted, is entirely at the risk of the students concerned and no concession in regard to attendance is allowed. Attendance will be calculated from the date the College re-opens after the summer vacation.

When a student is required to represent the College in competitive events - sports, cultural activities and debates sponsored by the College - he/she must apply for permission in advance, in writing to the Principal.

Exemption from attendance for other reasons may be granted only if permitted by the Principal in writing. Such permission must be obtained well in advance and not at the time of examination.

Application for leave of absence due to sickness/hospitalisation must be supported by a medical leave and fitness certificate from a recognised medical practitioner, and should reach the Principal within a week of the student re-joining college on the expiry of leave.

ORDINANCE VIII-E-'INTERNAL ASSESSMENT'

- (1) (i) The scheme for Internal Assessment shall be followed in the regular stream only, with exclusions as per the Appendix, and shall be applicable to the students admitted from the academic session 2003-04 onwards (i.e. to begin with for the first year students) in both undergraduate and post-graduate degree courses. This scheme of Internal Assessment shall not be applicable to the School of Correspondence Course and Continuing Education, Non-Collegiate Women's Educational Board and Non-Formal Education Cell (formerly External Candidates Cell). The specific Ordinances pertaining to schemes of examinations of various courses shall stand amended, mutatis mutandis, to the extent of internal assessment as laid down in this Ordinance, subject to exclusions referred to above.
 - (ii) Internal Assessment marks shall be shown separately in the Marks Sheet issued by the University and these marks shall be added to the annual/semester examination marks for determining the division of the student.
- (2) 25% of the maximum marks in each paper in undergraduate courses shall be assigned for Internal Assessment and the remaining 75% marks for the annual/semester University Examination; the time duration and other modalities of the annual/semester Examination with respect to this 75% component shall remain as per existing schemes of examination for various undergraduate courses.

- (i) (a) There shall be 10% weightage assigned to House Examinations to be conducted by each college, for all subjects in Pass Course and B.Sc. (General) and all papers of the main Subject in Honors courses.
 (b) The duration of each paper in the House Examination shall be the same as the duration in the University Examination. The maximum marks for each paper of the House Examination shall be 100 or the same as the maximum marks in the corresponding University Examination.
 (c) The University reserves the right to scrutinize some or all the scripts of any paper in any course in a College during the period of retention of papers, which duration shall be till declaration of results by the University, a copy of the question paper shall be sent to the Examination Branch of the University and the College shall maintain a proper record of the question papers of the House Examination.
- (ii) (a) Each student shall be assessed on the basis of written assignments/tutorials as well as on the basis of project reports/term papers/seminars. There shall be 10% weightage for such written assignment; and project reports/presentations/term papers/seminars. Each student shall be given at least one written assignment per paper in each term, subject to a maximum of 12 written assignments per year for all the papers taken together.
 (b) Where the maximum marks in a paper are less than 100, for example 50marks, the nature of written assignments/tutorial work shall stand adjusted *pari passu*.
- (iii) There shall be 5% weightage for regularity in attending lectures and tutorials, and the credit for regularity in each paper, based on attendance, shall be as follows:

- [Medical certificates shall be excluded while calculating credit towards marks to be awarded for regularity, though such certificates shall continue to be taken into account for the purpose of calculating eligibility to appear for examinations as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.9.(a)(ii).]
- (iv) There shall be a Moderation Committee for Internal Assessment in each College, discipline-wise, which shall comprise of the senior most teacher in the department, the teacher-in-charge of the department and the previous teacher-in-charge of the Department; provided that if, for any reason, the membership of the Committee falls below 3, the Principal of the college shall nominate suitable members from among the teachers of that Department/college to fill the vacancies.
- (3) With the introduction of Internal Assessment, the maximum marks for the University Examination in each paper shall stand reduced accordingly.
- (4) The promotion criteria shall be as per the existing Ordinances for University Examinations, as applicable to respective courses. In addition, the same criteria shall apply to the total of the University Examination and the Internal Assessment, taken together.
- (5) (i) There shall be a Monitoring Committee for Internal Assessment at the University level consisting of the Dean of College as the Chairperson along with three other Deans one of whom shall be a member of the Executive Council, and the Controller of Examination as Member-Secretary. The Committee shall monitor the receipt of Internal Assessment marks from various colleges and ensure timely compliance. If a College fails to submit

the Internal Assessment marks in time, the University shall not declare the result for such a course in that College. The responsibility for non-declaration of the result of any course in the college in such circumstances will be solely that of the college.

(ii) There shall be a Monitoring Committee for Internal Assessment in every College, which shall be chaired by the Principal of the College and will be made up of the Vice-Principal (and in case there is no Vice-Principal, the Bursar), Secretary Staff Council, and two senior faculty members to be nominated by the Principal. This Committee shall be responsible for the entire process of Internal Assessment in the College, including redressal of grievances, if any.

(6) (i) In the case of students who repeat one or more paper(s), or all papers of Part 1 or Part II or Part III, the Internal Assessment marks shall be carried forward.

(ii) In the following special cases, in lieu of Internal Assessment, students shall be awarded marks (for the previous years' papers) in the same proportion as the marks obtained in that paper in the University Examination:

- (a) Students who migrate from other Universities to the University of Delhi in the 2nd year;
- (b) Students who fail in the Part I Examination of Honours Courses and join Pass/General Courses in the II Year; and
- (c) Students who transfer from 1st year Pass/General Courses to Honours Courses in the 2nd year.

(iii) Students who migrate from non-formal streams in the University of Delhi (i.e. School of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education, Non-Collegiate Women's Education Board and Non-Formal Education Cell, formerly External Candidates Cell) to the Regular stream and vice versa, shall carry as such the marks obtained in the preceding year(s).

(7) Tutorials shall be held regularly for the post-graduate courses of the University by the concerned Department in cooperation with College; and at least 25% marks shall be assigned for Internal Assessment in each paper of the post-graduate courses. The Internal Assessment in the post-graduate courses may be based on regularity and attendance; class tests and house examination; and written assignments, projects/term papers/seminars/field-work. Post-graduate courses where the weightage of Internal Assessment is 25 percent or more, Departments may continue with the existing schemes.

(8) In the case of a student who is selected as a member of the N.C.C. to participate in the annual N.C.C. Camps or is deputed to undertake Civil Defence work and allied duties, or in the case of a student who is enrolled in the National Service Scheme and is deputed to various public assignments by or with the approval of the Head of the institution concerned, or a student who is selected to participate in sports or other activities organized by the Inter-University Board or in National or International fixtures in games and sports approved by the Vice-Chancellor, or a student who is required to represent the University at the Inter-University Youth Festival, or a student who is required to participate in periodical training in the Territorial Army, or a student who is deputed by the College to take part in Inter-College sports, fixtures, debates, seminars, symposia or social work projects, or a student who is required to represent the College concerned in debates and other extra-curricular activities held in other Universities or such other activities approved by the Vice-Chancellor, the following provision will apply:

(i) A student in the categories listed above, will have to fulfill the requirement of written assignments and projects/term papers/seminars/field-work with the flexibility, however, that he/she may, if necessary, be allowed additional time for submission of written assignments.

(ii) A student in the categories listed above, who is unable to write the House Examination on account of his/her participation in such aforesaid activities may be assessed by the College through an alternative mode in lieu of the House Examination. This may be done only in exceptional circumstances.

(iii) A student in the categories listed above will get the benefit of attendance for Internal Assessment for the classes missed as per the existing provisions of Ordinance VII.2.(9)(a)(i).

(9) (i) The University reserves the right to review, and if necessary moderate the marks in Internal Assessment in any paper/papers in any College/Department.

(ii) The respective University Moderation Committees in each subject shall moderate, if necessary, the Internal Assessment marks across Colleges.

RULES OF DISCIPLINE

1. Students are responsible for their conduct to the Principal and are prohibited from doing anything either inside or outside the college that will amount to a breach of discipline or interference in the discipline and normal working of the college. A student shall be liable to disciplinary action for violation of any of the rules of discipline. Disciplinary action may involve warning and/or suspension from classes, from the examination, from use of the College Library or even from the College as such, or any such action as provided for in Ordinance XV (B), XV(C) and XV (D) of the Rules of Discipline of the University of Delhi.

2. Students shall conduct themselves in a polite manner, both towards the members of the staff (teaching and administrative) and towards their fellow students. Insubordination, unbecoming language or ungentlemanly conduct including teasing etc., shall be severely dealt with.
3. Students shall maintain perfect silence in classrooms and desist from demonstration of disorderly behaviour. They must not loiter in the corridors or in front of class rooms or office rooms and must keep as quiet as possible at all times. During their free periods, student should work quietly in the Library or Reading Room, or spend the time without causing any disturbance. Smoking in the College hall, classrooms, laboratories, library and reading room is prohibited.
4. Students shall take proper care of the College property, furniture and premises and they must not spoil or cause any damage to or tamper with College property, furniture and fittings. They shall not spoil the lawns.
5. Students shall leave their bicycles, scooters or motorcycles in the shed provided for this purpose. No bicycles, scooters or motorcycles shall be parked in any other part of the College premises.
6. No society can be formed in the College without the permission of the Principal nor shall any person be invited to address a meeting in the College without the prior permission of the Principal.

ORDINANCE XV-B OF THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

Maintenance of Discipline among Students of the University

1. All powers relating to discipline and disciplinary action are vested in the Vice- Chancellor.
2. The Vice-Chancellor may delegate all or such power as he/she deems proper to the Proctor and to such other persons as he/she may specify in this regard.
3. Without prejudice to the generality of power to enforce discipline under the Ordinance, the following shall amount to acts of gross indiscipline:
 - (a) Physical assault or threat to use physical force against any member of the teaching and non-teaching staff of any Institution/Department and against any student within the University of Delhi;
 - (b) Carrying of, use of, or threat to use of any weapon;
 - (c) Any violation of the provisions of the Civil Right Protection Act, 1976;
 - (d) Violation of the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the Scheduled castes and tribes;
 - (e) Any practice- whether verbal or otherwise-derogatory of women;
 - (f) Any attempt at bribing or corruption in any manner;
 - (g) Willful destruction of institutional property;
 - (h) Creating ill-will or intolerance on religious or communal grounds;
 - (i) Causing disruption, in any manner, of the of the academic functioning of the university system;
 - (j) Ragging as per Ordinance XV-C.
4. Without prejudice to the generality of his/her powers relating to the maintenance of discipline and taking such action in the interest of discipline as may “seem to him appropriate”, the Vice Chancellor may, in the exercise of his/her powers aforesaid, order or direct that:
 - (a) any student or students be expelled; or
 - (b) any student or students be, for a stated period, rusticated; or
 - (c) be not for a stated period, admitted to a course or courses of study in a college, department or institution of the University; or
 - (d) be fined with a sum of rupees that may be specified; or

- (e) be debarred from taking a University or College or Departmental Examination or Examinations for one or more years; or
- (f) that the result of the student or students concerned, in the Examination or Examinations in which he/she or they have appeared be cancelled.

5. The Principals of the Colleges, Heads of the Halls, Deans of the Faculties, Heads of Teaching Departments in the University, the Principal, School of Correspondence Courses and Continuing Education and Librarians shall have the authority to exercise all such disciplinary powers over students in their respective Colleges, Institutions, Faculties and Teaching Departments in the university as may be necessary for the proper conduct of teaching in the Institutions, Halls and teaching in the concerned Departments. They may exercise their authority through, or delegate authority to, such of the teachers in their Colleges, Institutions or Departments as they may specify for these purposes.

6. Without prejudice to the power of the Vice-Chancellor and the Proctor as aforesaid, detailed rules of discipline and proper conduct shall be framed. These rules may be supplemented where necessary by the Principals of Colleges, Heads of Halls, Deans of Faculties and Heads of Teaching Departments in this University. Each student shall be expected to provide himself/herself with a copy of these rules.

7. At the time of admission, every student shall be required to sign a declaration that on admission he/she submits himself/herself to the disciplinary jurisdiction of the Vice-Chancellor and the several authorities of the University who may be vested with the authority to exercise discipline under the Acts, the Statutes, the Ordinances and the Rules that have been framed there under by the University.

ORDINANCE XV-C OF THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

Prohibition of and Punishment for Ragging

1. Ragging in any form is strictly prohibited within the premises of College/Department or Institution and any part of Delhi University system as well as on public transport.
2. Any individual or collective act or practice of ragging constitutes gross indiscipline and shall be dealt with under this Ordinance.
3. Ragging for the purposes of this Ordinance means any act, conduct or practice by which dominant power or status of senior students is brought to bear on students freshly enrolled or students who are in any way considered junior or inferior by other students and includes individual or collective acts or practices which:
 - (a) involve physical assault or threat to use of physical force;
 - (b) violate the status, dignity and honour of women students;
 - (c) violate the status, dignity and honour of students belonging to the scheduled caste and tribes;
 - (d) expose students to ridicule and contempt and affect their self-esteem;
 - (e) entail verbal abuse and aggression, indecent gestures and obscene behaviour.
4. The Principal of a College, the Head of the Department of an Institution, the authorities of College, of University Hostels or Halls of Residence shall take immediate action on any information of the occurrence of ragging.
5. Notwithstanding anything in Clause (4) above, the Proctor may also suo moto enquire into any incident of ragging and make a report to the Vice-chancellor of the identity of those who have engaged in ragging and the nature of the incident.
6. The Proctor may also submit an initial report establishing the identity of the perpetrators of ragging and the nature of the ragging incident.

7. If the Principal of College or Head of the Department or Institution or the Proctor is satisfied that for some reason, to be recorded in writing, it is not reasonably practical to hold such an enquiry, he/she may so advise the Vice-Chancellor accordingly.

8. When the Vice-Chancellor is satisfied that it is not expedient to hold such an enquiry, his/her decision shall be final.

9. On the receipt of a report under Clause (5) or (6) or a determination by the relevant authority under Clause (7) disclosing the occurrence of ragging incidents described in Clause 3 (a), (b) and (c), the Vice-Chancellor shall direct or order rustication of a student or students for a specific number of years.

10. The Vice-Chancellor may in other cases of ragging order or direct that any student or students be expelled or be not, for a stated period, admitted to a course of study in a college, departmental examination for one or more years, or that the results of the student concerned in the examination or examinations in which they appeared, be cancelled.

11. In case any students who have obtained degrees of Delhi University are found guilty under this Ordinance, appropriate action under Statute 15 for withdrawal of degrees conferred by the University shall be initiated.

12. For the purpose of this Ordinance, abetment to ragging will also amount to ragging.

13. All institutions within the Delhi University system shall be obligated to carry out instructions/ directions issued under this Ordinance, and to give aid and assistance to the Vice-Chancellor to achieve the effective implementation of the Ordinance.

ORDINANCE XV-D OF THE UNIVERSITY OF DELHI

Sexual Harassment

The present ordinance is based on the policy against sexual harassment by the Delhi University and seeks to maintain and create an academic and work environment free of sexual harassment for students, academics and non-teaching staff of Delhi university. The ordinance will also apply to outsiders and residents on the Delhi university campus to the extent specified in the University bulletin.

X. PRIZES, SCHOLARSHIPS AND FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE

PRIZES

The College awards following prizes to students:

1. **Dr. Jagmohan S. Pably Prize** - A prize of a value of Rs 150/-, awarded every year.
2. **Bhasin Memorial Prize** - A prize of Rs. 75/-, awarded every year to the student standing first in the M.A. (Prev.) Examination in History and securing at least a Second Division.
3. **Sharda Tuteja Prize** - A prize of Rs. 75/-, awarded every year to the student standing First in M.A. (Prev.) Examination in English, and securing at least a Second Division. In case no student in M.A.(previous) English satisfies the minimum condition for eligibility, the Prize will be awarded to a student studying B.A (Hons.) English III year on the basis of his/her result.
4. **K.N. Srivastava Prize** - A prize of Rs. 75/-, awarded every year to a student with the best performance in the Hockey team and having a good academic record.
5. **Anil Chopra Prize** - A prize of Rs.300/-, awarded every year to the best student in B.A. (Hons) History 1st year.

6. **Kripa Ram & Sita Wati Prize** - A prize of Rs. 125/- awarded every year.
7. **Bhammi Shah Ghai Prize** - A prize of Rs. 75/- awarded every year.
8. **Action Group Award** - Award of Rs. 40/- awarded every year to the student who gets the highest marks in Parts I & II of B.Com. (Hons.) Examination.
9. **Shaheed 2/Lt. Davinder Kumar Chopra prize** - A prize of Rs. 300/-, awarded every year to the all round best student of B.Sc. who shows excellence in studies and extracurricular activities.
10. **Ish Chandra Memorial Prize** - A prize of Rs. 300/-, awarded every year to an English (Hons.) Third Year student, on the basis of his/her combined performance in Part I and II Examinations.
11. **Brij Lal Memorial Books Award Prize** - A prize of Rs. 925/-, awarded every year to the student of B.Sc. (Hons.) Physics III year standing First in Hindu College.
12. **Shri Bishan Sarup Bansal Memorial Prize** – A prize of Rs. 3750/- will be awarded to the student securing First position in the College in B.A. (Hons.) Economics Third Year.
13. **M.K. Rastogi Prize** - Five prizes each of Rs. 1000/-, awarded every year to the topper of IIIyr. (Hons) Physics, Chemistry, Mathematics, Sanskrit and Hindi.
14. **Monica Teja Memorial Prize** A prize of Rs. 625/-, awarded every year to the student securing highest marks in M.A (Previous) English examination.
15. **Professor Prem Chand Memorial Prize** - A prize of Rs. 625/-, awarded every year in cash or kind to a student securing at least a First Division in M.A. (Final) Philosophy Examination.
16. **Raj Rani Bhardwaj Prize** - A prize of Rs. 2000/-, awarded every year to the student securing First Position, and at least 60% marks, in the B.A. (Hons.) History Part II Examination.
17. **Kalawati Gupta Prize** - A prize of Rs.2000/-, awarded every year to the student securing First Position, and at least 60% marks, in the B.A. (Hons.) History Part I Examination.
18. **Prof. M. M. Sankhdhar Memorial Prize**- A prize of Rs. 625/- to be awarded to the student securing First position in the M.A. (Previous) Political Science Examination.
19. **Madhu Bhasin Memorial Prize** - Two prizes of Rs. 3,400/- each awarded every year on merit basis to one student of B.A. (H) Eco IIInd yr. and one of B.A. (H) Music IIInd yr.
20. **Prof. Papiya Ghosh Memorial Prize**- A prize of Rs. 4,800/- will be awarded each year to the Topper of M.A. (Final Year) student of History of the College.
21. **B.N. Mitra Prize**- A prize of Rs. 1000/- p.a. will be awarded to the topper of B.A.(Hons.) English III Year
22. **Academic Prizes** - Academic prizes are awarded class-wise and subject-wise to students on the basis of their results in the annual examination.

SCHOLARSHIPS

The following scholarships are awarded to students:

1. Premvati Raghbir Singh Scholarships

Two scholarships, of the value of Rs.775/-, awarded every year among resident students who have obtained a First Division in the last examination taken and are in need of financial help. The scholarship money may be utilized for the payment of hostel charges, purchase of books etc.

2. R.B. Ram Kishan Dass Scholarships

Twenty-five scholarships, of the value of Rs. 1000/- each, out of a donation made by R.B. Ram Kishan Dass, awarded every year to needy and deserving students of the College provided they have secured at least 55% marks in the last examination taken and are not recipients of any other scholarship. Scholarships will usually be tenable for one year.

3. Ch. Bhagwan Sahai Chauhan Memorial Scholarships

(a) One scholarship, of Rs. 300/-, awarded every year to the student joining M.A. Sanskrit/ Hindi (Prev. and Final) securing the highest marks amongst those getting a First Division.

(b) One scholarship, of Rs. 300/-, awarded every year to a Chauhan Rajput student of B.A.(Hons.) I/II/III Year of Arts / Humanities who has secured a good division in the last examination taken.

4. Rai Achhru Ram Scholarships

Four scholarships, of the value of Rs.850/- each, awarded every year on merit to M.A./ M.Sc. students of the College. Two scholarships are for the Previous, and two for the Final year, class respectively. They will in the first instance, be awarded to Jain (Agarwal) students securing the highest percentage of marks and at least a second division in the examination concerned. In the absence of suitable Jain students, the scholarships may be awarded to Agarwal students fulfilling the required condition. In the absence of suitable Jain or Agarwal students, these may be awarded to other college students possessing the necessary qualification.

5. S.P. Raina Memorial Scholarship

One scholarship, of the value of Rs. 425/-, in the memory of late Shri S.P. Raina, Senior Faculty in English, Hindu College, Delhi, awarded every year to a B.A. (Hons.) III Year student of Arts/Humanities/Commerce on the basis of performance in the University examination in Ist and IInd year and who is not a recipient of any other Government, University or College scholarship.

The scholarship will be awarded on the basis of merit (preferably to a student with a First Division) cum means.

6. Ganpat Rai Gopal Devi Merit Scholarships

Two scholarships of the value of Rs. 625/- each, awarded every year to B.A.(Hons) History III year students on the basis of their performance in Parts I and II of the University examinations (preferably to those who have secured a First Division).

7. Lala Prem Lal Gupta Memorial Scholarship

One scholarship, of the value of Rs. 300/-, out of the donation made by Shri Hans Raj Gupta in the memory of his father, Late Lala Prem Lal Gupta, awarded every year on a merit-cum-means basis.

8. Jeevan Lal Khanna Memorial Scholarships

Two scholarships, of the value of Rs. 1750/- each, awarded every year on a merit-cum-means basis to Science Students. If no science student, or only one fulfills the conditions, the remaining scholarships may be awarded to Arts Students.

9. Mrs. Kailashwati Khanna Scholarship

A scholarship of Rs. 425/- for a year.

10. Nangia Scholarship

A scholarship of Rs. 400/- for a year.

11. Rajiv Mehra Memorial Scholarship

A scholarship, of Rs. 300/-, awarded every year to a needy and deserving student who is not a recipient of any Government, University, College Scholarship or any other scholarship, and it is usually tenable for one year.

12. Sultan Chand Memorial Scholarship

(a) One scholarship, of the value of Rs. 3100/- every year will be awarded to a B.Com (H) IInd year student, the topper of 1st year University Exam securing at least 75% marks in the 1st attempt.

(b) One scholarship of the value of Rs. 3100/- every year will be awarded to a B.Com (H) IIIrd year student, the topper of IInd year University exam securing at least 75% marks in 1st attempt.

13. Master Sheoprasad Memorial Scholarship

A scholarship, of Rs. 800/- per month for a year, awarded to a B.A./B.Sc. Mathematics student of II/III year on merit –cum-means basis.

14. Dr. Deepak Kumar Sinha Memorial Scholarship

A scholarship of Rs. 625/- per awarded every year to a student of B.A.(Hons.) Hindi Final year on merit-cum-means basis.

15. O.P. Kaushik Memorial Scholarship

A scholarship of Rs. 625/-, awarded every year.

16. Dr. S.S. Gulshan Scholarship

(a) One scholarship, of Rs. 3200/- for a year, awarded to the B.Com (Hons.) III year student who secures First Position in the Part II Examination.

(b) One scholarship, of Rs. 3200/- for a year, awarded to a poor student of B.Com (Hons.) III year who has secured at least 50% marks in the Part II Examination.

17. Prof. R. R. Gupta Memorial Scholarship

One scholarship of the value of Rs. 7700/- will be awarded to a needy and meritorious student of B.A. (Hons) Eng. (final year) on the basis of 2nd year result performance.

18. Smt. Brij Verma (w/o Mr. P.C. Verma, Principal, 1980-1995) Memorial Scholarship

One scholarship of Rs. 5500/- will be awarded every year to a student on the basis of “merit-cum-need” of Humanities/Social Sciences, with preference to a student of Hindi (Hons.) I/ II/ III year. The awardee should be a First Class who is in need of financial help.

19. Smt. Janadevi Rathi Memorial Scholarship

The details of Scholarship will be notified later on.

20. Dr. (miss) Usha Aggarwal scholarship

One scholarship of the value of Rs. 3500/- will be instituted for each Semester to B.Com. (Hons) students under the New Revised syllabus.

FINANCIAL ASSISTANCE TO NEEDY STUDENTS

1. Books for needy students.
2. Counselling services for physically challenged students.
3. College fee concessions are given to needy and deserving students on the basis of their performance in the last examination taken. Students desirous of getting concession should apply to the College office on the prescribed form.
4. Scholarship for Scheduled Caste/Tribe students-
Students belonging to scheduled castes, scheduled tribes and other backward classes, recognized as such by the Government of India, are awarded scholarship by their respective State Governments. Such students are required to apply to the State Government concerned on prescribed forms through the Principal immediately after joining the College.

ALL INDIA ENTRANCE SCHOLARSHIP EXAMINATION

Delhi University holds a competitive examination in Delhi in the month of October each year for the award of the above scholarships, which are 50 in number. Each scholarship is of the value of Rs. 250/- per month tenable for three years for pursuing an Honours Degree Course in the University.

The competition is open to students who have passed the S.S.C. Exam (under 10+2 pattern of Education) from the C.B.S.E., New Delhi, or an examination equivalent thereto with 55% marks in aggregate.

OTHER DISTINCTIONS/AWARDS/HONOURS

Mark of Distinction will be awarded to the outstanding sports students of the year, subject to the attainment of a minimum standard laid down for the purpose.

MARK OF HONOUR

Mark of Honour is the highest award of the College and will be awarded only to one student who shows excellence in studies, sports and other extra-curricular activities.
